I wish I could put into words what the Penns Valley Youth Center means to me and so many others. I have been blessed, not only having my two boys attend the Youth Center, but to be able to attend some of their events. I always come out of there getting much more than I've given. I've also come away realizing how much these kids need someone walking beside them. There is so much pressure and stress on these kids. It could be while sitting on the beach, out to eat, while sightseeing; anytime, day or night, and I do mean any time. They are always there to offer love, comfort and support to the community of PVYC. That goes for all of the PYVC staff and volunteers. Their motto is to "offer hope, worth, and friendship", but it also includes offering love, comfort, and support.

### "You never age out of the Youth Center"



I started attending PVYC at the end of my
7th grade year after hearing about it from a
few of my friends. By 8th grade, I was attending
every After School Program, Dinner, Worship
Night, Retreat, and event that I could. It instantly
became a family to me. I celebrated big and little
achievements, made lasting friendships with the leaders
and students, and got support through the bad times.

As I entered my high school years, I was always welcomed with smiles and excitement, no matter what kind of day the staff were having. I grew in my faith during this time and developed a better relationship with God, but the best part was getting to watch others grow in their faith. As I was ending my senior year at Penns Valley, I thought I was going to have to say goodbye to the program that shaped me into who I am today, but that wasn't the case. In the spring of 2019, PVYC did a trial run of the K5 program and I was asked to be a student leader, to which I said yes without hesitation. We had an amazing first month of the program but I was unsure if I would be able to continue as a leader since I was starting college. That summer was the Life Conference, a week-long retreat with 6,000 students from across the country, that only happens once every three years. During that week, my love for the Lord and the people I was with grew stronger than I could've ever imagined, and I knew I could not say goodbye just yet.

When I scheduled my classes for the Fall semester, I made sure my Friday afternoons were open and I became a part-time staff member for the K5 program. Now, in my junior year at Penn State, I am on staff for 6-12th grade as well. I spend all of my afternoons at the Youth Center, and I would not want it any other way. I wanted to help the younger generation experience what I got to because it really is life changing. I have made new friendships with younger students and have been able to help them through some of the same situations I had gone through. Being able to give back to the program that changed my life for the better is something I cherish.

In 2011, a concerned group of parents gathered with several young community leaders to discuss ways in which to address the fatherlessness and hopelessness that existed in the Penns Valley area. From those conversations, Penns Valley Community Church led the charge to establish a location in

the Old Gregg School Community & Recreation Center for teens in 7th through 12th grade to come

one day a week after school to hang out. From modest beginnings, the Penns Valley Youth Center began to have an immediate impact.

Our first group of students could be counted on a single hand. Today, more than 250 students make up our current roster and PVYC has influence throughout the community and in our local schools. Our students come from every demographic and social construct imaginable. Through our After School Programs, Youth Group, LIFE Groups, Retreats, and other events, the Penns Valley Youth Center is making a difference to students and their families across our community.

I came to PVVC when my parents filed for divorce. I play I came to PVYC when my parents the ator arvorce. I lived close by and walked past OGS on a regular basis.



PVYC literally is my family. In January, my mom died unexpectedly from what turned out to be pneumonia. A week later, her live-in boyfriend committed suicide because he couldn't deal with her passing. This left me without a place to live. PVYC and its stall took me in, setting me up with a home to live with a staffer, and belying me deal with the Juneral stuff, estate and insurance stuff, cleaning out the trailer and more. Over the summer, I was able to work through past burts with my estranged father who had been very abusive when I was a little kid. PVYC'ers took me to Kentucky to visit with him and to reconcile as he battled cancer. This fall, I was back in Kentucky for his Juneral. Despite this loss, I found closure knowing that we had made amends and had put the past behind us. If it were not for PVYC, I would have committed suicide years ago, I wouldn't have graduated from high school or gotten into college, I would not have been able to reconnect with my dad or have a relationship with my mom before they passed. PVYC truly has been a lifesaver for me, and I am so thankful for all that they did for me. Since I no longer have a family, I am now a part of the extended PVYC family and will be spending holidays with staff in their homes and have been adopted into their family. PVYC will always be a huge part of my story and the future that lies ahead.



### COVID-19 RESPONSE



The past two years have presented themselves with unique challenges for our team at the Penns Valley Youth Center. The COVID-19 pandemic forced us to pivot rapidly which brought out the best in our team, even as it highlighted areas of improvement. Immediately after the pandemic forced our closure of programs, our staff and volunteers shifted gears, moving to a completely virtual format for After School programming, Virtual Youth Group, prerecorded Worship Nights, regular drop-by visits (usually outside, distanced, and masked), and a huge mobilization of craft and STEM activities shipped weekly to families across the community. Each Monday, the local postmaster would grin as boxes of envelopes, mailers, and packages would be shipped to students who were isolated and lonely.

As time wore on, we were able to slowly reopen our doors, reviewing and altering nearly every aspect of our programming and the way we had done things previously. Even the days of the week that we were open were impacted. Throughout this process, our leadership team worked to continue developing revenue streams to support our staff who had shifted their approach to ministry.



### **2021 PROGRAM** HIGHLIGHTS

#### 6-12 AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

Students in Middle School, Junior High and Senior High School come to PVYC on Mondays and Wednesdays for healthy snacks, homework help, gym time, free access to counseling, and a great place to hang out with old and new friends!

#### **K-5 AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM**

Every Friday, Elementary School students enjoy games, STEM activities, develop their artistic and crafting skills, and spend time developing relationships with their peers in a fun and safe environment.

#### **WEDNESDAY DINNER**

Each week, members of our staff and the community partner together to cook and serve a fresh, homecooked meal to our students. Any leftovers are packaged and sent home so that families have an extra meal!

#### **YOUTH GROUP**

Students are invited to hang out at Youth Group each Wednesday after dinner for a time of singing and teaching. As a faith-based organization, we believe that a strong community rooted in faith in God helps everyone navigate the challenges of life.







The Food Centre serves as a hub in the Penns Valley community that provides free food from Panera, Trader Joe's, local food establishments and our very own gardens. From our tables at OGS, nearly \$150,000 in free foods are distributed each year.

#### CHURCH IN TEN

Each day an email is sent to recipients who enjoy a short devotional, a worship song, and prayer requests sent by community members. In ten minutes per day, people can grow in their faith, spend time in worship and pray for each other. It is like holding church in just ten minutes!

#### THE TABLE

The Table is a place where PVYC families and community members are welcomed to come, have a home-cooked meal, spend time worshipping God, engage in conversations about faith. and Reservations are required, but everyone is invited!

#### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

Encouraging students to give back and serve in the Penns Valley community is a hallmark of PVYC. We model this by helping local organizations and our local school district in many ways. We believe we honor God by loving others through service.



## **ACTIVITIES** & EVENTS





#### RETREATS

One way that our students grow their faith and build relationships with each other is by attending retreats. Due to COVID-19, all retreats have been held outdoors and in a single day. We hope to return to overnight weekends in 2022 and give our students amazing experiences at places close to home and afar.

#### **LIFE GROUPS**

By joining a LIFE Group, students can connect with PVYC leaders and peers who are seeking to grow deeper in their faith. Meeting every other week, these students are able to speak freely about the struggles of life and the challenges they face in their world. Over the years, LIFE Groups have served as the biggest impetus to spiritual growth and helping students discover who they were made to be!







Many students have limited opportunities to experience activities outside of typical extracurricular school district activities like sports, drama or clubs. We desire that every student realize the world is open and available to them if they work hard, make smart choices, and strive to do hard things. We work to help students engage in fun activities, local, regional and national trips, and find opportunities to explore their interests.

#### **IMPACT**



One of the best parts about PVYC is the willingness to think outside the box and be creative in engaging our community. As COVID-19 wore on, we thought about holding pop-up outdoor pizza parties using a portable pizza oven. At these events, neighborhood families could gather in someone's yard, and we would bring the pizza party. One oven has now turned into three ovens, and we have hosted gatherings of as many as 200 people. As it turns out, we make some pretty fine pies, and neighbors have been able to meet each other, some for the first time! Whether over a slice of pizza, helping to organize a fundraising drive for medical expenses, providing child care or rides, providing essential toiletries to students who would otherwise go without, or helping to work with local churches to offer family events and activities through Front Yard Mission, PVYC is striving to make our families and our community a better place to live!











# FAMILY & STUDENT SUPPORTS



#### COUNSELING

Gaining access to competent counseling is difficult for many in our community. By partnering with Centre Counseling & Wellness, Inc., PVYC brings a counselor to our facility each week so that students and families can find a listening ear that can help guide them through life.

#### FINANCIAL NEEDS

Everyone needs help at some point in some way. One way that is often needed in our community is financial assistance. Partnering with local organizations and using our own relief funds, we are able to walk beside families who need a little help to make ends meet.

#### **FOOD**

We may have many differences but we all eat! At every activity, function or get-together, we serve food. For some students, it may be the only hot meal they receive or the first vegetable they actually like. Opening doors to food access is one step in helping our community build better habits and make healthy choices.

#### **BIRTHDAY RECOGNITION**

Through the generosity of a local donor, each month we celebrate birthdays for each student involved with our programs. They receive T-Shirts and Gift Cards from local establishments. This effort helps each student feel like they belong and are seen!

Growing up is tough. So is raising a family. We recognize this and work hard to come alongside students, parents, guardians and local support organizations that strive to make growing up and raising kids a little bit easier. We do this through financial support, parenting help, building connections to service and support organizations, or making connections to local churches who can walk alongside families through their most difficult situations.

# PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

#### STAFF TRAINING

Our staff is unique in their backgrounds and come at problems and issues from their own experiences. This is often useful as our students each have different situations that they come from. By providing training and professional development opportunities, our staff is able to deal with some of the most difficult situations and confrontations imaginable. Over the years, we have dealt with abuse, depression, suicidal thoughts, neglect, assault, and other issues in the lives of our students and their families. Learning how to address these occurrences and the necessary coping skills that come from involvement in the lives of these students is helpful to continuing in this line of work.



### **2025 GOALS**

#### **PVYC BUSINESS OPPORTUNITY**

The Penns Valley Youth Center recognizes the need to increase revenue to continue operating our programs. We also recognize the need for local jobs for students and their family members, access to healthy foods, and stable housing. It is our goal to create a sustainable business opportunity that helps us meet those needs while providing revenue streams to not only support those endeavors, but to help maintain our existing programming. The following options are being considered:

- Food Distribution Warehouse
- Affordable Housing Apartments located above Storefront Business
- Restaurant/Coffee Shop

We continue to seek direction for opportunities to impact our community in creative and relevant ways that address the real needs that exist among our families at PVYC.



#### **IMPACT**

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE HIRE**

As our organization has continued to grow, it has become necessary to expand our staff to include an Administrative Assistant to keep us organized and moving ahead. Funding such a hire will be critical in order for us to maintain the pace which we currently keep, and to give our leaders the ability to cast new vision for the organization to maintain and enhance programming levels and activities.


